I understand the need for clear communication so there is no confusion.

I misspoke on October 18th when I said I saw your results because the ones I saw were from the earlier drug screens. I searched all the different text threads and emails to see if I missed the current drug screen results. That was the reason I could not find the results when I was sitting in your living room.

I spoke with Analyze America today after I finished with mediation and the MRO just released your results because they had to verify the results. You took a five-panel hair instead of the 17-panel and did not take the PETH test.

October 1st at 11:03am - I responded to your text with take a blood PETH and 17 panel hair follicle or nail bed drug test please.

October 1st at 11:11am - You responded to my text that you had an appointment scheduled for Friday.

October 1st at 3:36pm - You said the results for that will take days. Is that going to affect the unsupervised visitation this weekend?

October 11 at 1:35pm - I asked you if you had heard about your results without an answer. I was trying to work out the overnight visitation based on the results that were supposed to have been taken on October 4th.

October 16 - took 5-panel drug screen.

October 17 - You responded that you mistakenly ended up taking the same test as before - 5-panel instead of 17-panel. You never said you waited until October 16 to take your drug screen.

October 18 - home visit at 10:00pm - 11:00pm

October 29 - Positive drug screen results. Your test results are positive for Amphetamine and Methamphetamine.

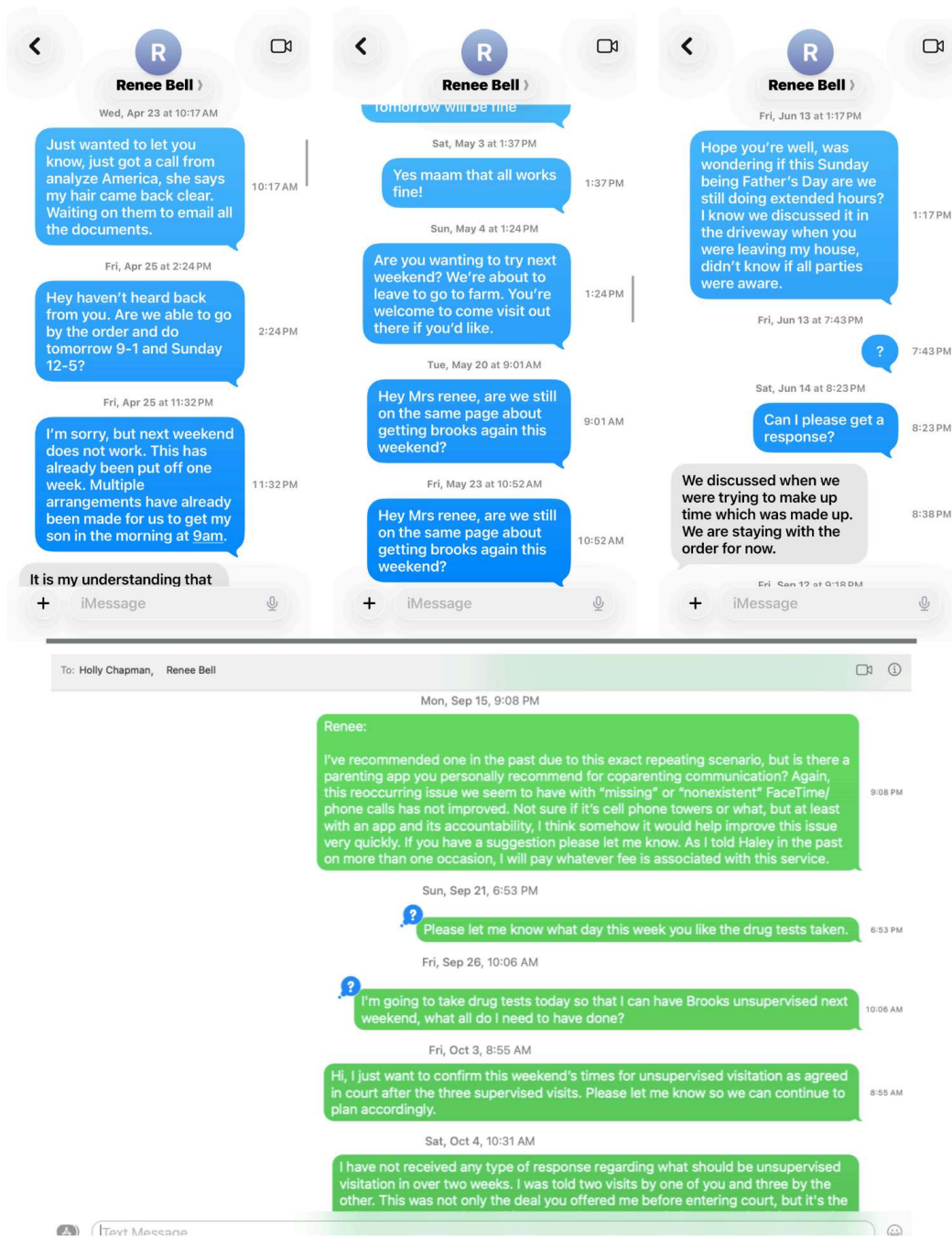

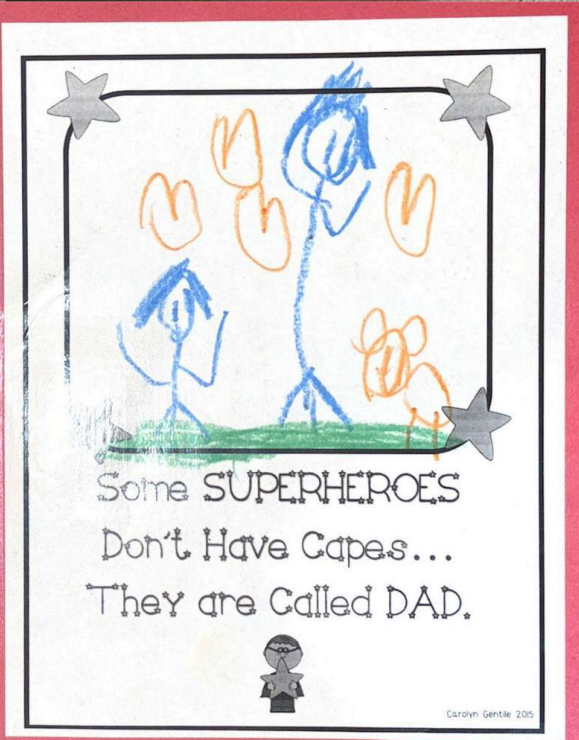

EXHIBIT F-1

Section F: Governing Law & Authority

Excerpts from Uniform Superior Court Rule 24.9 and O.C.G.A. § 19-9-3, establishing the advisory role of the Guardian ad Litem, the Court's exclusive authority over custody and visitation determinations, and the requirement that restrictions on parental rights occur only through court order.

USCR 24.9

(6) Unless otherwise directed by the appointing judge, the GAL shall submit to the parties or counsel and to the Court a written report detailing the GAL 's findings and recommendations at such time as may be directed by the assigned judge. At trial, the report shall be admitted into evidence for direct evidence and impeachment purposes, or for any other purposes allowed by the laws of this state. The court will consider the report, including the recommendations, in making its decision. However, the recommendations of the GAL are not a substitute for the court's independent discretion and judgment, nor is the report a substitute for the GAL's attendance and testimony at the final hearing, unless all parties otherwise agree.

(7) The guardian ad litem shall be subject to examination by the parties and the court and shall not be permitted to question witnesses or present arguments absent express approval of the Court.

OCGA 19-9-3

(2) The judge hearing the issue of custody shall make a determination of custody of a child and such matter shall not be decided by a jury. The judge may take into consideration all the circumstances of the case, including the improvement of the health of the party seeking a change in custody provisions, in determining to whom custody of the child should be awarded. The duty of the judge in all such cases shall be to exercise discretion to look to and determine solely what is for the best interest of the child and what will best promote the child's welfare and happiness and to make his or her award accordingly.
